Exceptional winners in an exceptional festival year: on the last day of the digital edition, the International Film Festival Mannheim-Heidelberg (IFFMH) announces this year's winners. The "eccentric, entertaining debut" and formal experiment *My Mexican Bretzel* has won the main prize, endowed with the biggest monetary reward. A total of six prizes in the international ON THE RISE competition have been awarded by four juries and the audience. The selection was made up of 14 debut, second and third fictional feature films by outstanding directors.

"We are delighted that the juries' decisions so fully reflect the breadth of the programme," says Festival Director Sascha Keilholz, commenting on the awards. "From the hybrid essay film, to the poetic melodrama, to the neo-neorealist fairy tale nightmare, all the way to the intense social study, the prize winners comprise a





wonderfully diverse array of voices from the world of cinema. Congratulations to them – and many thanks to the juries!"

# <u>International Newcomer Award - Best Director (€25,000)</u> MY MEXICAN BRETZEL

Director: Nuria Giménez Lorang, Spain

Excerpt from the jury's statement: "This year's ON THE RISE competition was very impressive, but nothing had as much fun and delivered as much joy in interrogating just what a film can be, and can do, as this hugely eccentric, entertaining debut that tricks you without cheating you, dazzles you without showing off, and lies to you so that, in every way that matters, it's absolutely truthful."

#### Rainer Werner Fassbinder Award - Best Script (€10,000)

Excerpt from the jury's statement: "Knowing what to reveal and what to withhold is a skill most writers take time to learn. But this beautiful, haunting and strange first film from China strikes that balance perfectly. [...] Single Cycle is a wonderful mystery that is all the more satisfying for being impossible to solve."

There's a reckless intimacy to this story of a couple, played by the directors themselves, exploring and exploding the boundaries of their relationship in sometimes witty, often messy, but always frank and honest ways."

Director: Dea Kulumbegashvili, Georgia, France

Excerpt from the jury's statement: "It is hard to believe that this provocative, profoundly disturbing drama from Georgia could possibly be a debut. There is a precision and a formal confidence that would be remarkable in a seventh film, let alone a first."

Excerpt from the jury's statement: "Framed by a scene of familial warmth and tenderness and told through an intensely personal aesthetic, *Una Promessa* shows the deeper significance of love in a world of poverty, humiliation, and death. The film leaves us with a strong statement on human dignity and the need for breaking the circle of exploitation and violence."

THE SLAUGHTERHOUSE (Original title: KOSHTARGAH)

Director: Abbas Amini, Iran

Excerpt from the jury's statement: "The film places an internal moral crisis at the heart of the narrative [...]. The film asks us, how can we be human in inhumane circumstances and in that sense bears a universal message that echoes well beyond the borders of Iran."
